Please explain how these funds will be used to provide a public benefit:

The South Carolina Network of Children's Advocacy Centers (SCNCAC) consists of 17 Primary and 12 Satellite Children's Advocacy Centers (CACs) located throughout the state and serving all 46 counties. CACs help abused children by providing forensic interviews and coordinating trauma-informed treatment response for those children. CACs reduce the trauma on children by eliminating the need for children to relive their trauma through multiple interviews with multidisciplinary team professionals while improving collaboration among all agencies involved in the child abuse response. Over the past 6 years, CACs in South Carolina have provided services to 62,774 children. The 12,897 children served in 2022 represent a 16% increase over the 2021. SCNCAC is the accredited state chapter of the National Children's Alliance and provides training, technical assistance, accreditation support, and statewide services to support the statewide response to child abuse in South Carolina. In Addition SCNCAC provides statewide protocol training and other assistance to multidisciplinary team partners, DSS and Law Enforcement agencies, to assist them in their investigative roles in the statewide response to child abuse. This funding will support all of the above activities by providing funds to CACs and SCNCAC for staff salaries and fringe benefits and equipment to support these services. The funds are also used to provide the SCNCAC statewide forensic interview recording evidence management system and other statewide technology that is used by CACs, Law Enforcement and DSS to protect the disclosures of children and enhance the statewide response to child abuse. This funding will be used to meet the increased demand for CAC services and ensure a best practice evidence based response to child abuse is available for all children and families in South Carolina regardless of background or demographics.
